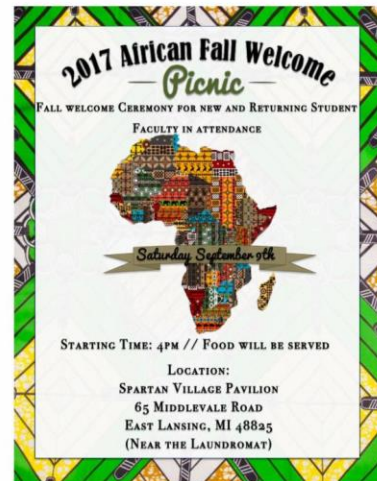
African Fall Welcome Picnic
