### Theme: Food Security in Africa During and Post COVID-19

#### Nigeria

**Presenters: Prof. Adewale Olusegun Obadina,** Head of Department, Food Science and Technology, Federal University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Ogun State, Nigeria

The presentation will be focused on the situation of food security in Nigeria in the face of the pandemic and a projection of the impact of COVID on Nigeria's food systems going forward.

#### Zambia

#### Presenter: Dr. Brian P. Mulenga, Research Fellow, Indaba Agricultural Policy Research Institute (IAPRI), Lusaka, Zambia

The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic worldwide has continued to affect all sectors of the global economy as well as at country level. Food security has not been spared by the pandemic, with food supply chain interruptions being the main impact channels. Developing countries, like Zambia, which are mostly characterized by fragile and informal food systems, and highly depend on imports for agricultural inputs, were projected to be among the hardest hit with far-reaching effects on national food security. It is now over seven months since Zambia recorded its first COVID-19 case in March 2020, which triggered public and private sector responses to mitigate the effects of the pandemic on food security, among other developmental and welfare sub-sectors. This talk aims to provide insights in regard to the following three key food security questions: What measures were put in place and to what extent have these been effective in safeguarding food security? What is Zambia's food security status in the face of COVID-19? What is the country's food security outlook in the short- to medium-term in the face of COVID-19?
