The talk will draw on examples of how downstream partners attempt to interpret the technocratic demands of donor programming into local contexts. The reality of this process often leads to challenging activities that seem to endorse rather than transform inequalities. Using these examples, this talk claims there is a desperate need to do things differently beginning and not ending with the local context. #### **Claffey Meyer International Travel Grant**

Deadline: Monday, March 1st, 2021

This award provides financial assistance to domestic students who intend to travel to developing countries for the purpose of providing technical assistance, participate in research, or engage in service. The intent is for students to work towards discovering and implementing solutions in response to urgent human needs (for example: food security, environmental quality, health and nutrition, education, and other areas) and, thereby, to encourage careers in international development teaching, research and practice. Grants are intended to support travel, related living expenses, and projects costs—not to be used as a tuition

#### Dr. Charles and Marjorie Gliozzo Dissertation Research Scholarship

Deadline: Monday, March 1st, 2021

This scholarship is available to MSU doctoral students with dissertation research objectives who have defended, or are in the process of defending, a dissertation proposal. The scholarship supports field research abroad in support of the student's dissertation.

#### Walker Hill Scholarship

Deadline: Monday, March 1st, 2021

The Walker Hill International Award is available to MSU doctoral students to be used for pre-dissertation visits to a doctoral research site in a country outside the United States (for international students, research in one's own country does not qualify). The student must have completed adequate credits and be able to submit a description, appropriateness and feasibility of pre-dissertation research objectives to be accomplished during the period spent abroad. Financial need may be considered. Previous recipients of a Walker Hill award or an ISP Predissertation Travel Award are not eligible.
