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



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While COVID-19 has posed unprecedented challenges to education around the globe, teachers and educational leaders in Kenya's Dadaab refugee camps face unique constraints as they navigate school closures. Since March, they have worked to adapt with limited resources, minimal access to digital technologies, and supporting students who faced significant barriers to schooling before the pandemic hit. Yet these educators bring significant expertise to teaching and learning under difficult conditions. This panel draws on the diverse experiences of educational leaders in Dadaab who, from different institutional vantage points, have shaped the response to COVID-19 for the nearly 70,000 students enrolled in camp schools.
