Theme: Old and New African Diaspora Networks: Before and After COVID-19

Date: May 21, 2020

This conference was initially planned as a physical event at the University of the Witwatersrand in South Africa. This became impossible in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic. It will not be held virtually and further details on the technological modalities will be communicated to those selected.

Carneige African Diaspora Fellowship Program (CADFP) Application

What is the CADFP?

The CADFP is a scholar exchange program for African higher education institutions to host a diaspora scholar for 14-90 days for projects in curriculum co-development, research collaboration and graduate student teaching and mentoring.

Who is eligible?

- Accredited universities in Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda and member institutions of the **African Research Universities Alliance (ARUA)** can submit a **project request** to host a scholar.
- Scholars born in Africa, who live in the United States or Canada and work in an accredited college or university in either of those two countries, can apply **online** to be placed on a roster of candidates for a fellowship. Scholars must hold a terminal degree in their field and may hold any academic rank.

How do I apply?

Call for Proposals: Faculty-Directed Education Abroad Program Innovation Fund

Proposals should be emailed to the **Assistant to the Executive Director of Education Abroad** and clearly indicate that the application is for the Faculty-Directed Education Abroad Program Innovation Fund initiative.

Submit:

- A narrative description of the proposed or revised program, with a focus on aspects that make the program unique and support students' personal, professional and intercultural learning and development (maximum 500 words)
- A budget for the intended activity (site visit, conference attendance, technology, etc.)
- A brief description of how each item requested in the budget will facilitate program development
- Letters of support from the sponsoring department's chair and the college's lead representative on the **MSU Advisory Council on Education Abroad**

Education Abroad will provide funding up to a maximum of \$5,000 per approved proposal. **Applications will be accepted until August 1, 2020.** A maximum of five (5) program development grants will be awarded annually.
