Nancy Kendall is professor of educational policy studies, specialized in comparative, international, and global education policy, at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is affiliated with the African Studies Program, Department of Gender and Women's Studies, Development Studies Program, and Global Health Institute. Kendall conducts comparative ethnographic research on the school and life experiences of marginalized girls, boys, families, and communities.Her ethnographic research has examined children's sensemaking and experiences with gender and education, political democratization, sexuality and HIV/AIDS education, orphan-focused international programming, and college-going.

he Hatfield Lioness Scholarship, is now open for applications from female students who have applied for a taught postgraduate course.

The aim of the Lioness Scholarship is to enable a female student from a developing country where access to tertiary education is limited, to benefit from undertaking postgraduate study at Durham University. You can find the list of eligible countries <u>here</u>.

The scholarship will be awarded to an individual who has the academic and personal qualities to enable them to complete and benefit from a postgraduate course, and who will act as a positive ambassador for their home country in Durham. We would also like them to put their enhanced knowledge and skills gained from the master's program, as well as their experience of being in Durham, to good use for the benefit of their society when they return home.

The scholarship will fund the following for one academic year:

Full payment of University tuition fees Stipend for living expenses Return travel from your home country to Durham Self-catered accommodation in Hatfield College A 'settling in allowance' when you arrive The cost of a UK Visa and the UK Health surcharge
