

The African Studies Center Invites Applicants for the FLAS Fellowship for the Study of African Languages: Intensive African Language Summer 2018 and Academic Year 2019-2020

- * FLAS Fellowships come with tuition and a stipend
 - Academic Year Undergraduate 2019-2020: \$10,000/year in tuition and \$5,000 in stipends
 - Academic Year Graduate 2019-2020: \$18,000/year in tuition and \$15,000 in stipends
 - Intensive African Language Summer 2019: \$5000 for tuition and \$2,500 for stipends

Both graduate and undergraduate students may apply

Fellowships are awarded to qualified students in programs that combine the study of foreign languages with advanced training and research in an African focused academic or professional area

The conference intends to create a forum where African and Africanist scholars discuss the transformation of Africa. Building upon past AGSA conferences, this year's conference seeks to interrogate how localized activities in different spaces (on the continent and in the diaspora) are transforming Africa in the global context, while also interrogating what the continent's future challenges and prospects are.

Study Abroad: History, Culture, and Schooling in Southern Africa

May 18- June 23, 2019

Application Deadline: March 1, 2019

History, Culture, and Schooling in Southern Africa will travel to South Africa and Lesotho in the Summer I term (May 18-June 23) of 2019. Students will spend time visiting historical and culture sites in South Africa and Lesotho, as well as visiting a varied group of education institutions. These will be located in urban and rural areas, and will include educational institutions that are not part of the formal education system. These experiences will help the students learn about the history of educational efforts in the region, and how struggles for educational equity and fairness are intimately connected to the history and cultures of the region. The program is run through the College of Education, and there are seven (7) credits of classes embedded in the program.

Four of the credits are Integrated Arts and Humanities credits (IAH 211). The other credits are offered in the Teacher Education program, though students that come from other majors and programs can contact the trip leaders (John Aerni-Flessner: AerniFL1@msu.edu and Molade Osibodu: Mosibodu@msu.edu) for other potential options. Development and NGOs: Internships in Malawi





This program offers a unique, exciting, and 'life-transforming' opportunity for serious students to receive academic credit while participating in an immersive, 7-week international internship with a non-governmental organization (NGO) in Malawi, a small vibrant country with warm welcoming people in southeast Africa. The goal is for students from any discipline to understand and critique development processes through the lens of an NGO in a structured manner. It is jointly organized through the College of Social Science, the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, and the Center for Gender in Global Context. Students participate in an exciting field excursion and orientation during the first week in-country, followed by six weeks in a full-lime internship with an NGO that match each student's interests. While taking courses with significant Africa content is preferred, the program exposes students to the culture, development context, and issues to be expected in Malawi through required attendance in several pre-departure academic program sessions during the Spring preceding the summer trip in order to cover any course deficiencies.

In Africa, thousands of NGOs work on development projects agriculture, environment, gender, health, livelihoods, governance, human rights, and others. Both the underlying development processes and the roles of NGOs to effect positive change are complex and need deeper understanding. In examining these projects, we further found that gender relations often determine who has access to critical resources. By studying complex issues such as women's access to land and other natural resources, healthcare, household divisions of labor, and national and international economic development policies, students will gain a holistic understanding of the cultural and societal forces that can constrain, and in some cases, empower families as they attempt to improve their well-being in Malawi and beyond.



NOTE: Once applications are submitted to the internship provider, withdrawal penalties will apply. Please contact the Office for Education Abroad with questions regarding withdrawal as penalty schedules for internships abroad may be different than other program types.

ARIS Center Fellowships on Advancing Research Impacts in Society Deadline: January 30, 2019

The NSF-funded ARIS Center was recently launched with a mission to Advance Research Impacts in Society.

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM. The ARIS Center is implementing a fellowship program intended to increase the quality and availability of scholarship and resources about research impacts through:

- Projects that synthesize existing scholarly work to package evidence into easily applied and digestible tools that can be used by the research community to improve research impacts design and practice
- Small-scale innovative scholarship that explores new horizons and advances knowledge about research impacts.

Both types of projects require recipients to create products such as guidance documents, white papers, scholarly articles, decision support tools, multimedia supports, instructive videos, or other creative or scholarly outputs.

FELLOW SUPPORT: Fellows are provided three types of support over the course of approximately one year:

- participation in a community of fellows working to advance research impacts
- peer-review and editing of products under development along with publishing/production and dissemination support
- A small stipend to individuals or for organizations to offset the cost of fellowship work and/or fellowship related travel (\$5,000 for single fellow award, \$7,500 for team projects split among collaborators)

ELIGIBILITY: Professionals, researchers, faculty, educators, graduate students and others from universities, colleges, and other organizations working to advance practice and improve outcomes of research impact.

DUE DATE: Applications are due January 30, 2019

Council of American Overseas Research Centers Fellowships

NEH Senior Research Fellowship

Deadline: January 24, 2019

The CAORC National Endowment for the Humanities Senior Research Fellowship Program supports advanced research in the humanities for U.S. postdoctoral scholars, and foreign national postdoctoral scholars who have been residents in the U.S. for three or more years. Fellowship stipends are \$4,200 per month for a total of four consecutive months.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- carry out research in a country which hosts a participating American overseas research center. Eligible countries for 2019 are: Algeria, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Cambodia, Cyprus, Georgia, Indonesia, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Nepal, Senegal, Sri Lanka or Tunisia;
- be postdoctoral scholars;
- be U.S. citizens or foreign nationals who have been residents in the U.S. for three or more years prior to the application deadline;
- be able to carry out research for four consecutive months between the period of May 2019 and November 2020.

Council of American Overseas Research Centers Fellowships

CAORC Multi-Country Research Fellowship

Deadline: January 24, 2019

The CAORC Multi-Country Research Fellowship Program supports advanced regional or trans-regional research in the humanities, social sciences, or allied natural sciences for U.S. doctoral candidates and scholars who have already earned their PhD. Preference will be given to candidates examining comparative and/or cross-regional research. Scholars must carry out research in two or more countries outside the U.S., at least one of which hosts a participating American overseas research center. Approximately eight awards of up to \$10,500 each will be given each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be a U.S. citizen. Proof of citizenship (photocopy of passport) must be shown upon award notification:
- have a PhD or be a doctoral candidate who has completed all PhD requirements with the exception of the dissertation;
- be engaged in the study of and research in the humanities, social sciences, or allied natural sciences:
- seek to conduct research of regional or trans-regional significance in two or more countries outside the U.S., one of which must host a participating American overseas research center. Please note that in accordance with U.S. Department of State travel warnings, travel is not currently possible to the following countries with overseas research centers: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Iran, Iraq, Pakistan (senior scholars may be permitted to travel to Lahore and Islamabad subject to approval), and Yemen.

As indicated by such movements as #RhodesMustFall, the manner of organizing and disseminating knowledge about Africa remains fairly hegemonic. Scholarship about Africa relies on specific cultural viewpoints and political interests, and, lamentably, fails to take into consideration knowledge production occurring on the continent outside the confines of privileged spaces of academic instruction. This predicament provoked the Liberian scholar, Robtel Pailey, to ask, "where is the 'African' in African Studies?"

Presentations are welcome from a diverse range of disciplines in the social sciences, arts, and humanities. We are also interested in papers that engage with art, society, governance, and education. The conference is primarily a forum for graduate students to present their research to a cross-disciplinary audience. All presenters will be notified of acceptance by February 8th, 2019. Accepted presentations will be considered for publication in the Pan-Africanist journal.
